ATLANTA ART WALK

Atlanta's sprawling Beltline and fair weather makes it ideal for public art and murals, and the ongoing development from Ponce City Market to Inman Park to the Krog District and Old Fourth Ward means that access to art while walking, running, biking, skateboarding, rollerskating along the Beltline is just steps away from more and more urban dwellers snapping up those apartments and condos that form continuously denser outcroppings around it. It's also a connector to Piedmont Park which is then a short jaunt to the High Museum, a place you can spend hours exploring or simply visit a single exhibition. And, just a bit beyond it you'll find top art and design school, SCAD — and SCADFASH, a tightly curated fashion museum near the back of the campus with beautiful outdoor event space where you can grab a breather during your visit. This former Equifax headquarters, comes with some old school corporate perks which translate nicely for students and all those who enter.

You can create your own art walk in Atlanta on the Beltline, though neighborhoods like Little Five Points — through Piedmont Park — and to and through museums and galleries. It's rife with beauty and opportunities to move your body and be moved by the constantly transforming creative landscape.
